Florida Virtual School® and University of Florida Partner for Dual Enrollment Program

Orlando, FL (July 18, 2018) – Florida Virtual School (FLVS®), a statewide online public school district, is partnering with the University of Florida (UF) to offer a dual enrollment program for current FLVS Full Time high school students in the 2018-19 school year.

This dual enrollment program is designed to help eligible accelerated students in FLVS Full Time access the University of Florida’s coursework that will help them get ahead in their studies. These courses are taught entirely online and led by the faculty at UF. This program allows students to fully understand the real college learning experience, and to see first-hand what they can expect throughout their college career. This program will also allow students the opportunity to accelerate in their studies and take courses that count towards high school credit and, ultimately, towards a university degree.

“UF is excited to collaborate with Florida Virtual School. This partnership provides an opportunity for high achieving, high potential FLVS students to experience the academic rigor and engagement of Florida’s flagship university from wherever they live in our state,” said Dr. Brian Marchman, Assistant Provost and Director at the University of Florida. “It is our hope that by introducing this program to FLVS students while in high school, each will consider becoming a Gator or pursuing higher education in a university of our caliber.”

Dual Enrollment credits may be in addition to the normal school load or a part of the student's regular course load. Some of the courses that are eligible for Dual Enrollment include Art Appreciation, College Algebra, Trigonometry, Marriage and Family, various foreign language courses, and Theater Appreciation, to name a few. Students may not take more than two UF Online Dual Enrollment courses per semester.
